3) President's report.

Welcome.

On behalf of the EPF I wish delegates and guests welcome to the 2013 European General Assembly. I want to thank the organiser, by the meet director Vladimir Mati and the Czech PF's President Miroslav Vasek for inviting us to Plzen.

I am looking forward to a pleasant stay and a very well organised championship because Mr. Mati has showed in previous organizations of European and World championships that he is a splendid organizer.

European Championships 2012.

A lot of hard work and good planning created European championships of good technical and social standard in 2012. Statistics show that all together 805 (*828) lifters took part in European championships in year 2012 which is slightly less than the year before. In 2012 no Danube Cup was organized.

It is a high standard on European lifters and *Ielja Strik from the Netherlands and Jaroslaw Olech from Poland* were awarded European lifters 2012.

Antidoping.

In year 2012, EPF made 63 (81*) doping tests at European championships. This means that about 8% of all lifters were tested. 1 lifter tested positive and is suspended for 10 years.

A lower number of IC tests were carried out in 2012 than the years before. The reason is that WADA as well as IOC require IPF to make more OC (out of competition) testing compared to IC testing.

IPF require that about 5% of the participants in Regional and World championships are tested in competition and the remaining antidoping money finances the OCT program.

Due to lower number of IC testing, EPF has transferred 15.000 Euro to IPF for OC testing in 2012 and expect to transfer the same amount also for 2013.

In 2012 IPF carried out about 50 OCTs.

To change the mentality in some federations from being tolerant about doping abuse to zero toleration is a national concern. If there are not a strong support by the Government in a country, the officials and coaches must in all their work institute rules that stimulates to fair play in the sport. But they must also institute hard punishments for those who are cheating.

EPF and IPF make doping controls in and out of competitions but the work to really minimize doping abuses must be done by the national federations and in clubs and training studios.

We all know how important the anti-doping work is for the sport of powerlifting to be accepted by IOC and also worldwide as a sport with integrity.

High standard of European lifters.

I like to express my congratulation to all European medallists at World championships.

European lifters won 32 out of 45 medals at the Open Worlds and 58 out of 102 medals at the Junior Worlds. In addition, European Master lifters and Bench pressers in all age categories won a high number of World medals last year.

This great progress is a result of hard work by the athletes but also a big credit to European coaches and training systems as well as the leadership in national clubs and federations. You should all be very proud of this success.

World Games.

The World Games 2013 are organized in Cali in Colombia and start end of July. The qualification to take part was at the Open Worlds in Puerto Rico last year. 28 Men out of 40 and 18 Women out of 40 are from Europe. Let us hope they will have great success at this prestigious championship – which is like the Olympics for our sport.

New visions and strategic planning.

The EPF administration has in 2012 worked with several projects to improve our organization. Even small details may turn out to be important because also big buildings are made of small pieces.

La Manga Club (LMC) in Spain is a well-known sport and recreation centre. The EC has signed a contract with LMC to establish facilities for powerlifting. During 2012, platforms and powerlifting equipment are installed. La Manga Club offers now a good equipped training studio for powerlifting and general strength training suitable for training seminars for powerlifters or just combining training and vacation together with the family.

Another project was to harmonize the music at European championships. The taste of music is different but at our championships we must please both the lifters and the audience as well as highlight our ceremonies. Due to this, the EC (thanks to Ralph Farquharson) has worked out appropriate music which is mandatory to use at all Europeans. This music list will of course be subject to improvements or changes as we gain experience.

To improve the internet streaming from our European championships, the EC also work to provide a better web host and better quality of the internet lines at the venues. Today, the streaming is not working well when a large amount of spectators log in.

We will solve this project together with IPF.

The EC is also working with a company that produce IOC recognized nutrition. This could be a good support for powerlifters and is part of the EPF anti-doping work.

Thanks to the EPF Officials.

Due to the appointment of Dietmar Wolf as new IPF Treasurer, he had to leave the EPF EC and some relocation was needed in the EPF Executive. Hopefully, the proposed candidates in the EC will be accepted and elected by the GA.

Thank you very much to Dietmar for his long service as EPF Secretary General (since 2005). His efforts and dedicated work has really been a good support to both the daily work to administrate EPF and to make up new strategies for EPF to move forward.

No federation or company is better than the people doing the work and I am proud to state that EPF has dedicated and hard working officials that cooperate perfect in the leading team and also cooperate well with our members.

Thank you very much to Jiri Hofirek, Alain Hammang, Ralph Farquharson, Myriam Busselot and Sandro Rossi as well as all EPF officials in various committees - you do a great work to run and administrate the EPF!

Good luck.

I hope we will have useful discussions and make good decisions at this General Assembly and I wish you all a successful Open European Powerlifting Championships 2013.

Report from the Auditors Committee.

Dear members of the EPF Congress,

As every year we started our audit by going through a paper file provided by Alain Hammang. After that Marina and Alain met in Luxemburg on April 8th 2013 to check the records and bank statements and clarify any questions from the paper approval. Again due to early booking some travel costs concern the next EC-workshop in 2013. This is not avoidable. Furthermore we corrected a few little mistakes concerning bookings in wrong categories or belonging to different events. Besides that we didn't notice any problems. Thanks to Alain again for his careful work!

Incomes and expenses in the balance sheet correspond to the bank statement of period 1_{st} to 31_{st} December 2012. All expenses are in full compliance with the EPF Constitution and By Law.

Three points are remarkable:

As an effect of Alain's teamwork with an ACCESS developer, the booking system has been improved Significantly. Now it is possible to show debits and credits for each championship, event or project separately. Using the new reports, it is easy to get an overview for example over investments in La Manga HPC. Furthermore with the new features, it will be easier for the auditors to check the Bookings.

The EWMOP in Mariupol / Ukraine was organised rather badly. Therefore Ukraine had to pay 1.500 € as an organisation penalty fee. This fee, as well as the sanction fee of 750 € were covered by the National federation's part of the participating fees. Furthermore due to the specific problems in Ukraine and bad experiences in the past, this championship appears with additional costs in the balance sheet. For safety reasons and to ensure transport of the kits, the doping tests were outsourced to a Swedish agency. This caused higher expenses of estimated 2.500 € compared with doping tests done by own people. Therefore we recommend not to give further championships to Ukraine until the situation has not been verifiably improved. A national federation should be able to provide good and reliable conditions for everybody who is involved in a European Championship, especially for the athletes. The EC should not take any foreseeable risks for its championships.

Finally we recognised that some critical votes exist concerning the big amounts which are paid to IPF for OCT. No question that any expenditure of funds from EPF must have support in the statutes and rules agreed by the Congress. For this reason we propose to solve the payment for OCT via IPF after setting clear rules agreed by the Congress.

*Pavol Muller question the amount of fees EPF paid to IPF toward OCT testing during 2012. He stated it must be outline in the rules and By-Laws. EPF President Arnulf Wahlstrøm explains that the IPF reduce ICT from 10% to 5% and that each region must pay more toward the OCT programme. The IPF president Gaston Parage stated that all fees collected from Anti-Doping should be spent on Anti-Doping

6) Secretary General Report.

Dear congress delegates, member federations, ladies and gentlemen!

First of all, I would like to express my thankfulness to all lifters for their achieved results, affiliated member federations for their work on national level, and to the EC- and Committee members for a very good cooperation during the last year.

EC - Board and Committees:

It might look nearly exaggerated, that in some situations the work of the EPF is too much highlighted or praised. But, caused to the fact, that all board- and committee members show high professionalism, an excellent cooperation, and simultaneously handle their daily workloads on a solution - orientated way, builds an atmosphere, which stimulates all of us to continue developing the EPF in a high-quality way.

The EPF is always striving to promote and develop powerlifting in a very superior and prudent way, but wishes also to provide a high performance powerlifting on the platform. That this striving and basically superior work from all involved persons gets a face, the media office and organizers play an important role. For to reach spectators, fans and all others who are interested or should become interested in powerlifting, not only in Europe, but also around the world, high quality internet streaming, internet (Twitter/FB) and other kind of medias are requested. From EPFs side, efforts are planned to improve all these media offers. For to succeed with the media work, is it important, too, that all member nations cooperate with the EPF media officer concerning exchanging of important lifter-, or and championships information or other highlights connected to powerlifting.

The EPF has, in cooperation with "La Manga Club", established a "High Performance Training Centre in La Manga/Spain. The first leg has been completed, as 2 lifting platforms are installed and equipped with 2 combined powerlifting racks from ER and with 2 complete Eleiko sets (bars and plates).

The EPF/IPF and La Manga Club are now in negotiations again to establish a separate strength training room (400 square meters) equipped with 6 combined powerlifting racks from ER, and 6 complete Eleiko sets (bars and plates) and primarily intended to powerlifting.

La Manga lends itself to seminars and competitions, too. All necessary facilities are available and nearby included a lot of sun over longer periods.

Here, a high appreciated thank you goes to Ralph Farquharson, he worked tirelessly on this case, he established the first contacts between LAM/EPF/ he negotiated / he worked out drafts and finalized the negotiations between "La Manga Club" and the EPF.

World Championships in Puerto Rico:

Without any doubt, probably the World Championships in Puerto Rico were the biggest highlight for the EPF in 2012, caused to the fact, that the WC 13 was considered as a qualification championship to the World Games 2013. As the actual nomination list to the

WG 13 assured, more than 50% of the total number of participants is coming from Europe. The European participants are divided in 20 female lifters – directly qualified, plus 5 reserve lifters, and 27 male lifters – directly qualified, plus 9 reserve lifters. The EPF is proud of our female and male lifters, and appreciates their high performances on international level last year. They are brilliant and exemplary ambassadors for our sport.

"Unequipped" Championships:

The EPF - EC got a suggestion to organize "Classic" European Benchpress Championships in the future. To your information, it is not the duty of the EPF – EC to establish such a championship. Proposal(s) must come to the EPF congress.

The EPF board has discussed and concluded to wait and see how the "Classic" World Championships" will be adapted from all the nations and lifters during the next years. With this "Classic" World Championships a top level championship is provided and will be a parameter on which way "Classic" Powerlifting will develop itself. And as you know, "Classic" World Cup", now "Classic" World Championships", was launched 2010 by the IPF as test events (a trail project) over the next years.

We also have taken into consideration the following: more championships means, we need more organizers, too, to fulfil the complete competition schedule during the whole year. The EPF competition calendar is already booked up until end of 2015.

I also like to say a few words in relation to "Unequipped" powerlifting.

"Unequipped" powerlifting is an upcoming young new division, and can be helpful for recruiting new lifters to powerlifting in general, a positive step. But we should not rush, as with all new objects, we need to have fundamental parameters (figures) to be able to analyze trends/movements, before we discuss to establish such championships on European level. Therefore this movement should grow on national levels first during the next years.

And if we after a couple of years get confirmed, that "Unequipped" powerlifting is good established as a new division, then it must be necessarily space for both divisions (equipped/unequipped); the intension should/can not be that "unequipped" powerlifting will then replace "equipped" powerlifting on national and international level in the future. "Equipped" lifting has a long history in powerlifting, and has a lot of fans and supporters. If we are able to recruit new lifters in this new division "unequipped", and on the other hand loose lifters in the division "equipped", it does not make any sense and will be a disadvantage for powerlifting in general. Then the intention to recruit more members to powerlifting will fail.

Powerlifting has struggled a lot with doping abuses in the past. The IPF realized that all these doping abuses over years have had a negative impact for the IOC recognition and the reputation of the powerlifting in general. Therefore the IPF introduced a stricter anti doping policy in all regions, and invested a lot of money in the anti doping work/controls. The effect of this strict anti doping policy resulted in a lower rate of positive lifters on international level until 2011

In the light of this, we must be aware, that new established championships on international level, will give us also new challenges in direction doping abuses. New recruited lifters, maybe also from various kinds of sports, too, will participate at these championships, and not all are familiar with doping controls. The national member nations should therefore ensure that international participating lifters are over a longer period affiliated club-, national powerlifting federation members, as well, to ensure they are integrated in the national anti doping policy/work.

The reason why I broach this issue is, that doping controls carried out at "Unequipped" international championships resulted in 9 doping abuses in a period from June 2012 – December 2012. The IOC recognition is under processing, I do not hope, that the increased number of doping abuses in 2012 will be a seat – back for the IOC recognition.

Concerning doping abuses in the EPF 2012

The EPF has set itself a goal to minimize the number of positive lifters from our affiliated member nations at European-, World Championships, WEC, Cups and national level.

To summarize, we have had 4 positive lifters in 2011 and now 4 positive lifters in 2012 again, which means that we were not able to reduce the number of positive lifters from 2011 to 2012. Two nations (2/2) were involved in these doping abuses 2012.

Of course, compared to the high number of EPF participants on international level, we could be satisfied with only 4 positive lifters in 2012. But we must keep in mind, the EPF is a part of the IPF, and the total number of positive lifters from all regions in the IPF counts concerning the IOC recognition.

All of us leaders/trainers/lifters must take responsibility in this matter; therefore, I strongly encourage all our member nations again, to continue with their anti doping work/programs for their lifters trainers and leaders. If not, the IOC recognition will be unreachable for us in the future.

A special thanks to our president Arnulf Wahlström and Championship Secretary Jiri Hofirek, and all other board members working untiring on a high level for the EPF.

A great thank, too, to all doping officers and to all referees, who have represented the EPF in an excellent way with high quality work on international level.

Secretary General EPF:

Because I took over the office as IPF interim treasurer in November 2012, I left my office as SG in the EPF. I served the EPF since 2001, first in different committees, and later on as an EC member. It was a big pleasure for me serving all of you.

I have had the possibility to work together with fantastic and motivated people in the EPF – EC. They inspired me, showed high professionalism, an excellent cooperation, and respected me as a person and stimulated the work I have done. An enormous thank also to all member nations of the EPF (lifters/ trainers/ leaders/volunteers etc). It was a great pleasure for me to meet/work/discuss together with you, which has enriched my life.

Finally I would like to wish everybody a successful General Assembly and successful European Championships!

Time fly's as one ages!


In 2012, I was present at the European Open Championships, the European Masters Championships, the European Open Bench-Press Championships, the Western European Championships and also the World Open Championships.

- EPF Championship Secretary Report.

Dear Sport colleagues,

My work on last year was similar as on all past years. Nevertheless, there were some matters which do problems with my Championships Secretary duty. These maters are similar as on next year:

1. Last sending Nomination of lifters to European championships.

Some Federations are waiting to the last day with sending Preliminary and Final nomination. In the case that they forget insert some lifters into the nomination, the officials of these Federation often ask me, several days after date of the nomination, if they can do a correction and if they may add next lifters to their nomination. EPF Executive Committee always disapproves these requests. Keep on your mind that late nominations and additional refilling the nomination will not be accepted.

All nominations for Championships can only be put forward by accredited official of federations and not by unknown person or individual lifters. This official must send the nomination to me, to Meet Director of the Championships and to President and Secretary General of their National federations. Individual nominations will not be accepted.

Some officials don't know that sending of the final nomination is obliged and that no federation can take part at the championships if they didn't send the final nomination. And regarding the final nomination: no reserve lifters can be included in the final nomination.

- 2. Filling of the preliminary nomination forms.
 - in preliminary nomination is necessary to state for which categories will be referees available,
 - in preliminary nomination must be stated the best results of several lifts not only total results of lifters,
 - most of federations don' t apologize referees who will not participate at the championships. The national federation may withdraw any referee latest 7 days prior to the championship.

No coaches or officials may drink beer or other alcohol inside of the warm-up area. Organizer and EPF delegates will control it and these people will be excluded out from warm-up area or from sport hall.

I would like to wish you a successful General Assembly and very good European Championships.

9) Proposals.

9.1 By-Laws 103.2.2. (EC)

Sanction fee for international matches: EUR 200

Reason: Sanction of an international match means work and responsibility for EPF and should be compensated by a fee.

A sanction means that the competition is included in the EPF Calendar, doping control must be arranged and EPF take on the responsibility that WADA rules and IPF rules will be followed.

**Voting: 26 for 1 against - Passed

9.2 Replace the Western European championship (WEC) with an EU championship. (EC)

Reason: More nations, like the Baltic nations, want to join the WEC.

If establishing an EU championship, more nations can take part including the Baltic nations. An EU championship will be open for all EU members and associated members.

**Voting: 9 for, 18 against – Failed

If the Danube cup shall continue is up to the organizing nations of this cup to decide.

9.3 By-Laws 105.16. (EC)

If the promoter does not return Technical Checklist within stated time limit, he will be fined a sum of Euro 125."

To be changed to:

If the promoter does not return Technical Checklist, *Promoters Contract and the Anti-Doping Control Agreement* within stated time limit, he will be fined a sum of Euro 200 for each. Total Euro 600

Reason: It is important for EPF to have all 3 contracts returned in due time to go forward with the work to prepare the championships.

**Voting: 27 for, none against - Passed

9.4 By Laws 105.13. (EC)

......If a referee from that nation is not present, or if present, is not available to act in the capacity of either referee or member of the jury during the championship/cup, the lifters are allowed to take part, but the fine of Euro 250 500 has to be paid by the nation.

Reason: At all European championships, except the European Open, it is problem to have enough referees. The few referees that attend works often whole days.

Some nations send many referees to the European Open but pay the fee of 250 Euro for not sending referees to other Europeans. To pay only 250 Euro is cheaper than sending a referee. If the fee is raised to 500 Euro, the federations may rather send a referee. Without enough referees, it is impossible to organize championships. The fine to be used for helping referees present at championship

**Voting: 12 for, 11 against, 4 abstentions – Passed

**Amendment from Germany second by Luxembourg. That if a federation send more than 1 lifter without a referee available for 2 days, they would not be allowed to take part in the championship. **Voting: 10 for, 17 against – Failed

9.5 European Classic Bench Press Championships (Finland).

The Finnish PF proposes for the EPF, that it should start to arrange European Championships in Classic Bench Press.

Reason: EPF has informed that it will consider what IPF decides on raw lifting. IPF decided Nov. 2012 to start World classic championships in powerlifting 2013.

Bench press is equal sport with powerlifting and should have international raw championships.

Raw powerlifting and raw Bench press should have a chance also for championships.

Especially juniors raw is good to start with but also Open benchers are willing to lift raw, not to forget Masters
** The IPF president Gaston Parage point out that IPF does not organize Classic Bench Press
championship. IPF is the governing body for Powerlifting and region must follow the IPF lead.

**Voting: 5 for, 15 against, 2 abstentions - failed

9.6 European Classic Open, Sub Junior and Junior Championships (Denmark).

Introduction of official RAW (classic) European Championships for: open class men and women – sub juniors and juniors. Continue with the equipped championships as they are. After 2 years, in 2015, an evaluation is to be made at Congress to find out whether changes to the above should be made.

Motivation: Equipped powerlifting is stagnating, whereas RAW lifting is becoming still more popular. Equipped lifting has become still more supportive, which causes problems for the EPF and the IPF and the referees who find it difficult to handle the situation. One example is the latest illegal introduction of the super Katana low cut. It is also vital for the EPF to introduce official World championships in RAW (classic) powerlifting as there is a risk that RAW lifters will otherwise find other federations where to perform their lifting. The EPF needs more members and lifters and not less.

"After a long discussion it was finally agreed to stage a European Classic Open, Sub-Junior and junior in 2017. Denmark offered to host the championship. An application must be forwarded to the EC prior to the GA in 2014"
